

CARING FOR CALATHEA

Sunlight

Watering



Keep the soil consistently moist but not soggy. Water your Calathea when the top inch of the soil feels dry to the touch. Ensure good drainage, as these plants don't like sitting in standing water.

Humidity

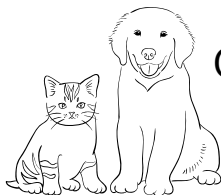


Calatheas originate from tropical regions, so they thrive in high humidity. Mist the leaves regularly or use a humidity tray to increase moisture around the plant. You can also place a small humidifier nearby.

Soil



Use a well-draining, peat-based potting mix. Calatheas prefer slightly acidic soil. You can also mix in perlite or orchid bark to improve drainage.
